The Witness Blanket Exhibition Cedar Hill Recreation and Arts Centre Friday, December 3 at 1:30 pm

The Witness Blanket is a powerful art installation created by master carver Carey Newman to recognize the atrocities of the residential school era, honour the children and symbolize ongoing reconciliation.

Inspired by a woven blanket, the original cedar-framed artwork is made of hundreds of items from Indian residential schools, Survivors, churches, governments and other cultural sites across Canada. Each item tells a story of loss, strength, resilience and pride.

The Witness Blanket is currently undergoing conservation at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights (CMHR). This true-to-scale reproduction has been created and is touring other venues, allowing its stories and messages to continue being shared.


