Respiratory viruses, including

COVID are on the rise, sooner than expected. Many of you will have heard the recent announcements from the Ministry of Health regarding Infection Prevention and Control measures to be put in place by Oct 3. Staff, and visitors to The Cedars, will be required to wear masks when in common areas of the building. (Masks are not required in The Dawson). A Greeter will once again be in place at the entrance to The Cedars simply to check on health status, instruct on sanitizing and provide a mask. There will be no rapid testing or checking of immunization status. The Ministry are not applying previous major restrictions but are adopting a measured approach to prevention and control of infections.

We all need to do what we can to remain healthy. This means good nutrition, supplements if you feel they are of benefit, rest and good hand and cough hygiene. There will be flu and COVID immunizations available by mid/late October in the community. An on-site immunization clinic for Cedars and Dawson residents will be held on Weds. Nov. 1. Very importantly, if you feel unwell, do not pretend otherwise as some of us are want to do! Stay off work, stay in your apartment, restrict your contact with others in order to reduce the risk of spread, please. We have test kits available so don't hesitate to ask Barb or Jonathan for one or two kits.

I have been asked to raise awareness about the noise levels in the dining room. With many windows, as lovely as they are, these hard surfaces add to the noise level of crockery, cutlery, loud voices and loud laughter. Please be cognizant about how you might help to reduce the noise volume. For an understanding of how hearing loss is affected and managed in such environments do attend the awareness session scheduled for Tues., Oct. 3 by Island Deaf and Hard Hearing Centre.

My Homestead Days

I was born in a log cabin in Fort Assiniboine, Alberta. It was the district nurse's home across the Athabasca River from my parent's homestead a few miles away. There was no bridge yet at this crossing, there was a ferry in the summer and an ice bridge in the winter.

We also lived in a log house which my Dad built when he made a claim for a homestead on a 1/2 section (160 acres) of land. To get title to the land you had to dig a well, build a house, clear so many acres ready to plant a crop and physically live on the land for a certain amount of time. After you met these requirements you could apply for the title to the land.

When I was six years old we bought a goat named Nellie who I then learned to milk.

We also had a few cows and some chickens. We had a very large garden and every fall we filled the cellar under our house with root vegetables and also with many jars of the wild berries we had picked and canned.

In the spring we would fall asleep to the sound of frogs singing in the natural ponds on our land.

I remember one spring a forest fire came through and it took many hours of hard work through the night to save the big log barn my Dad built.


My Dad also drove the school bus for our district for 19 years. My mother milked the cows and looked after the chickens and the garden.

We had no electricity so everything was done by hand including the laundry and

the cream separator which we had to turn the handle really fast and sometimes my three sisters and I took turns at it when we were old enough.

It was a very quiet and peaceful way of life.

We are currently accepting applications for local Artisans.


We are also accepting donations of Christmas items, costume jewellery, and craft items for the Dawson Heights Craft Table, where money raised will go to the Residents' Fund.


